three other music teachers who were also able to draw on a wealth of musical skills.

The quartet's own compositions are probably best categorized as bebop. The phrasing and tempi were just right, giving the audience a musical treat. Tom Timmler didn't have to say much. The two sets of the Sunday open-air concert spoke for themselves. The quartet around the musician from St. Georgen combined skill and musical maturity.

The Zell Culture Association has been promoting the town for years with its events at the old concert shell. Probably no other venue in Radolfzell has such a picturesque ambience on the lake. The jazz matinees on summer Sundays have brought this wonderful location back into the consciousness of the people of Radolfzell. But many guests also enjoy being entertained.
